1. ADAB	Assisting women who have experienced or are currently experiencing domestic violence and abuse. The full range of support will offer a culturally sensitive service in South Asian Languages (Urdu/Punjabi/Pushto). Beneficiaries = 150 women	£10,000
2. EAGLE WINGS	Offering regular, weekly activities (two mornings per week) for asylum seekers and refugees, encouraging lasting and beneficial friendships, supportive relationships and individual assistance and help where needed, plus events and trips for families Beneficiaries = unspecified, over 40 weeks	£9,000
3. JCFT	Running monthly workshops over 12 months, providing a listening space for participants, with facilitated training by experts inc. teaching practical tools and signposting to resources to help recognise threats/hate crimes and domestic abuse and to build resilience to acquire the techniques to tackling these issues.	£4290
4. VICTORIA CC	To provide a range of youth activities with a particular focus on sexual health, volunteer trainee youth workers, cyber-crime prevention	£9,800
5. SAMARITANS	The project can help around 2,700 pupils in Bury keep safe and help reduce harm and offending locally. Working with 13 secondary schools to be involved over 3 weeks in October, aimed at Year 8 pupils. It will deliver community safety messages on anti-social behaviour, serious violence, child exploitation, domestic abuse	£6,735

BURY ONE STEP	Expand our confidence-building workshops to include young people aged 16 –25, (e.g. delivering self-defence classes for young women) Create awareness-raising resources including the creation of visual arts, aimed at ensuring survivors and those at risk of domestic abuse know how and	£10,000

JRC	<p>The Jewish Representative Council provide non-Jewish primary schools an opportunity to visit Jewish schools and synagogues during the week of GM Hate Crime Awareness Week (7th -13th February, 2022).</p> <p>The purpose of these visits is to create understanding between Jewish communities and non-Jewish communities in the south of Bury. This is particularly important as a significant number of hate crimes take place in the south of Bury which are directed towards people from the Jewish faith. Considering this, we feel that allowing people of no faith, or of other faiths, to mix with people who are Jewish will foster understanding and hopefully contribute to the reduction of hate crimes in the south of the borough.</p>	£2,160
YOUR SUPPORT MATTERS	<p>Your Support Matters will deliver a series of training sessions with GP's and healthcare professionals across Bury about their role in identifying and supporting a person who is a victim of hate crime or mate crime. It is intended that this will be achieved by engaging with medical centres across the borough.</p> <p>Online and in-person training for PA's about hate crime and mate crime sessions to help and advice PA's to identify signs of mate crime and support the individuals to report hate/mate crime.</p> <p>Statutory staff awareness session in partnership with Bury Council and Bury Police about mate crime and hate crime.</p> <p>In partnership with High Schools deliver awareness session to pupils around the use of language of hate crime, disability and the social model</p>	£10,000

UPLIFT UNITE	<p>Deliver 6-week peer support programme providing early intervention and confidential support for victims of crime. Each weekly session for 10 people involves a Listening Circle.</p> <p>Each session also focus on empowering participants to feel more confident and prepared to reintegrate into the community, assisting them to improve their quality of life. Workshops include self-care, mindfulness and other holistic approaches. Our objective is to promote positive mental health and wellbeing. At week 6 there is the potential signposting to other services and the opportunity for participants to attend a trainer of trainer's course to deliver this programme to others as a volunteer for Uplift Unite.</p>	£5,570
SUNNYWOOD PROJECT	<p>Youth Support Programme: SPRUCE EXPLORERS. Building upon our previously funded SPRUCE. This new project will work with young people (YP) from Bury referred from local schools, police or youth offending. It will be a 6 week programme for 6-8 young people, with each workshop lasting 4 hours (24 hours contact time per YP) which will be repeated to new individuals over 6 cycles totalling 36 weeks with a capacity for 48 young people to take part. The project will support those attending to improve the understanding of local green spaces whilst reflecting on personal aspirations personal development.</p> <p>In addition to this, the programme will operate from the new Sunnywood Project Hub: allowing an improved purposeful and safe learning environment for participants to have better access to resources and a calming, space such as the counselling room, should it be required.</p>	£9,106
CARITAS (RED DOOR) PROJECT	<p>Purpose of the award is to expand services and activities by funding the upgrade of the centre facilities specifically the main community room and the kitchen. This will allow Red Door to continue delivering homelessness</p>	£5,000

	<p>services enabling them to extend services to 5 days per week. The improved facilities will allow Red Dorr to provide hot refreshments information and advice that supports people to access health services along with education, training, volunteering opportunities into employment.</p>	
BURY PEOPLE FIRST	<p>BPF will deliver 5 Hate/Mate crime workshops for people with learning disabilities delivered by people with lived experience. Each workshop will be co-produced with information leaflets in easy read to support the learning in workshops.</p> <p>The purpose will be to build up confidence, self-esteem and presentation skills of 4 people with learning disabilities. These individuals will deliver the workshops.</p> <p>The 5 drop in sessions will use techniques such informal discussions about individuals concerns and worries about Hate/mate crime and any issues they may have when being active members of their communities.</p>	£8,339
